

REGULATION ON THE

OWNERSHIP OF REAL ESTATE BY NON-SAUDIS





Executive Summary & Law Objectives

Saudi Arabia is undergoing a transformation under Vision 2030, aiming to diversify its economy beyond oil through real estate, tourism, and gigaprojects like NEOM, Qiddiya, and Red Sea Global. The real estate sector is a cornerstone of this strategy, impacting 120+ economic activities.





Real Estate **Ownership Law**

On July 14, 2025, the Council of Ministers approved a comprehensive update to the 2000 law governing property ownership by non-Saudis.

Effective January 2026, this law allows broader ownership and rights for:

- Non-Saudi residents and investors
- Foreign companies
- Non-Saudi non-profits
- Saudi companies with foreign shareholders
- In specific zones such as Makkah & Madinah, non-Saudi ownership is permitted under regulated conditions

Law Objectives:

- 1. Attract FDI (Foreign Direct Investment)
- 2. Retain global talent
- 3. Enhance real estate's contribution to GDP
- 4. Improve urban living and property quality
- 5. Stimulate real estate supply and job creation

Regulatory Entities:

- 1. REGA (Real Estate General Authority): Supervises enforcement.
- 2. Geographic Scope Document: Will define exact areas and rights per city.
- 3. Implementing Regulations: To be published within 180 days of the law's issuance

Key Provisions of the Law:



Mandatory Real Estate Registration for all transactions



15 legal articles outlining ownership rights & responsibilities



Subject to 10% total fees, including a disposition tax



Penalties up to SAR 10 million for violations or false information

- Non-Saudi individuals (residents or foreigners)
- Non-Saudi companies and non-profits
- Diplomatic missions and funds
- Saudi companies with non-Saudi shareholders
- Muslim investors under specific religious and regulatory conditions for Makkah & Madinah
